VOLUNTEERS

1. The main priority at the Sanctuary is the welfare of the wolves. Please treat them with calm actions and gentle tone of voice. Wolves are born afraid of humans and this is their home. Remember that some of them were rescued from abusive situations and must not be subjected to loud noises, running, or explosive actions.
2. Smoking and pets are not allowed at the Sanctuary.
3. Proper attire for working around wild animals includes long pants and close-toed shoes.
4. When driving one of the Sanctuary vehicles please do not smoke or pick up friends, relatives, etc.
5. When driving any vehicle into the Sanctuary, please use extreme caution and drive slowly when next to or between habitat fences.
6. The wolves are dependent upon WWS maintaining a good reputation in order to keep our program and their home running in good condition. Therefore, we ask that you do your best to represent yourself and WWS in the best way possible. Please always be polite to business owners, local residents and tourists. The plight of both captive wolves and wild wolves is judged by those representing them.
7. Please be punctual! Due to the inconvenience of locking and unlocking several gates, plus the distance of our road, much valuable time is lost when people are not on time. If you can't make your appointed time, please let us know at least 40 minutes in advance.
8. If you accidentally break something please let the Director know right away. Breaking things is a part of life sometimes, but it is important to have things returned to working order as soon as possible.

9. It is not appropriate to bring others to work with you. We are under strict rules with USDA, ODA, Fish & Wildlife and other agencies. All volunteers and employees must be approved by our Director. If you wish to bring a friend or family member, you may set up a special time with the Director.
10. Please do not “borrow” tools and equipment, and kindly return these items to their proper place when finished using them. Chasing down lost tools, etc., is extremely time consuming and causes undue stress in emergency situations.
11. We try to keep a happy environment at the Sanctuary and ask that folks maintain a positive attitude.
12. Since it can take many months for wolves to accept a new human, we do ask that you commit to a set amount of time. If you do not feel you will be interested in working at the Sanctuary for up to 6 months, please either decline to volunteer or make a special plan with the Director.
