## Volunteers

The Sanctuary's purpose is to provide a safe and natural environment for our resident wolves. The wolves should be cared for with the upmost respect. All volunteers should always have a calm demeanor when around the animals and should never yell or have an explosive or aggressive attitude. The following guidelines are to be referenced at all times while at the Sanctuary.

- Our Dress code is very simple, we encourage any WWS T-Shirts, Sweatshirts, and Jackets with long pants and closed toe shoes. Our Gift shop has many options available at an employee discount for purchase
- We are a smoke free environment.
- Personal pets are not allowed on sanctuary grounds
- When driving to the sanctuary, please use extreme caution and drive slowly when next to the habitats.
- Gates must be locked at ALL times.
- Represent yourselves in a professional and positive manner at all times.
- Please be punctual. If you are unable to work your shift please let us know in advance, so we may find someone to work for you.
- If you accidentally break something let us know ASAP.
- Do not bring other people to work with you. We are under strict guidelines with the USDA, ODFW, and other agencies. All volunteers and interns must be approved through our director and or managers on site. If you wish to bring a friend or relative please let us know and we will set aside a time that works best for the Sanctuary.
- Borrowing tools or equipment is prohibited. We are a non-profit organization
  that depends on donations and many items have been generously donated to us
  so we are able to do our jobs properly.
- All water containers in the habitats are to be cleaned of debris, and algae daily.
- Additional duties include: cleaning, filling holes, removing unwanted materials from the habitats, checking for hazards, cleaning wolf houses, and learning about proper behavior while inside the habitats.
- Trained volunteers will prepare and distribute food for all animals. This consists of cleaning food bowls and cutting meat. Latex gloves are provided. If you have a latex allergy you will not be allowed to do this task.

- Maintain roads which may include operating a chain saw, lawn mowers, weed trimmers. Rocks will occasionally need to be removed from the roads. Clearing limbs, trees that may fall on the road or in habitats.
- Keep trash cans clean and removal of garbage twice per week to the county land fill is necessary
- Assist with tours
- Fundraising and working for donations
- Distribution of brochures, rack cards, newsletters to businesses
